

Apartheid? Visit a hospital

ome people accuse Israel of practicing Apartheid: Uninformed leftist politicians, journalists, clerics, self-important social elitists, but most frequently pro-Palestinian activists, charge Israel with engaging in racist policies reminiscent of South Africa decades ago.

Israel's hospitals are my first argument in response. Accusers should visit any Israeli hospital. They will quickly become immunized(!) against that canard:

- Arab patients are treated by Jewish doctors and nurses. Jewish patients are treated by Arab doctors and nurses, or any combination of the foregoing.
- In multi-patient rooms, Arab patients lie next to Jewish patients. Arab families visit their sick, just like Jewish families. Often, an injured Palestinian terrorist has found himself recovering next door to his injured Jewish victim. Israeli hospitals regularly treat the sick of Gaza on humanitarian grounds. These have even included Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh's daughter, his granddaughter and his cancer-stricken mother-in-law. Palestinian Authority ambulances deliver emergency patients to Israeli hospitals. There are no separate wards for Arabs and Jews. All receive the same level of treatment.
- Arab doctors head medical departments, In the "miracle year" of 1948, Israel not just like their Jewish counterparts. Arabs



 It is often claimed the higher birthrate among Arabs, and a faster-growing Arab population, is an important factor affecting the Palestinian-Israeli conflict. Still, the fertility wards of Israeli hospitals are filled with Arab and Jewish patients. The governmentfunded health services pay for IVF treatments for all couples to have two children.

As with other segments of Israeli society, the hospitals, serving all without regard to religion or ethnicity, refute the false claims made by the critics. Shaare Zedek's trauma unit is a major facet of home-front preparedness for the next war our neighbors promise us.
